



In Finland the time students spend studying is one of the lowest in the countries surveyed by PISA

The resources allocated to education are OECD average

Average performance in reading (in score points)



Money Talks - or Does It?

- PISA results show that there is a positive relationship between investment in education and average performance up to a threshold of USD 50 000 in cumulative expenditure per student from age 6 to 15
- However, after that threshold, there is almost no relationship between the amount invested in education and student performance.
- In Australia, the United Kingdom and the United States all spend more than USD 107 000 per student from age 6 to 15, yet scored no better than (and in some cases, below) Canada, Ireland and New Zealand, all of which spend between 10% and 30% less.
