


The Right to Learn development programmes

Right to Learn goals for ECEC:


- 1. We will create equal conditions for learning paths


Early childhood education form the bases for lifelong learning


Curriculum planning, implementing and evaluation from national to local and individual level



- Finnish ECE Act (2018) draws up the guidelines for national core curriculum for ECEC, which is a basis for local curricula.
- An individual ECEC plan is drawn up for each child in ECEC centres and in family daycare.
- Same system in pre-primary education curriculum planning according to the Act of Basic Education.



The Framework for pedagogical activity of Finnish Early Childhood Education and Care






The conception of learning in ECEC

- The entity of education, instruction and care with pedagogical emphasis
- A holistic approach in promoting child's growth, development and learning
- Children's development is supported ensuring that they learn to act as well as to use their competence also for the good of other people
- In ECEC the care situations are always both educational and instructive situations where children learn e.g. interaction skills, taking care of oneself, time management and good habits.




Figure: The main areas of Children's linguistic development in Finnish ECEC (2018)
