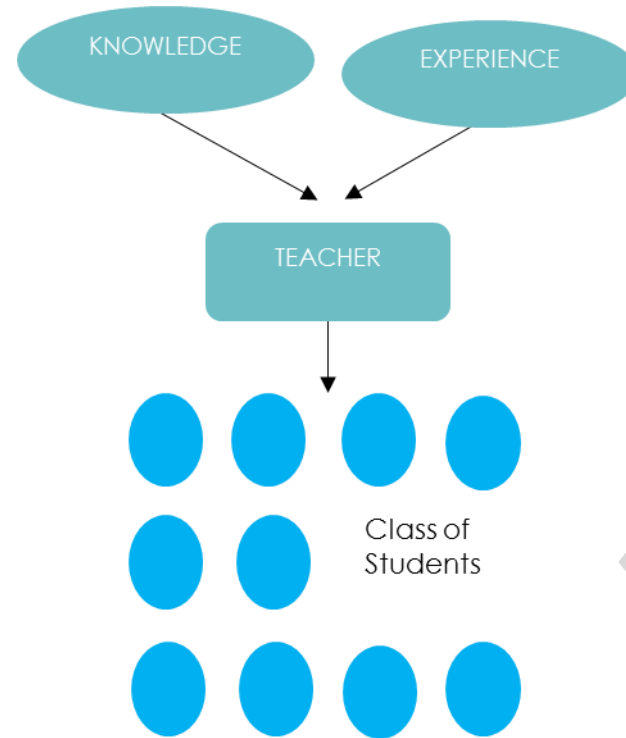
WHY?

The paradigm shift of teaching and learning is here.

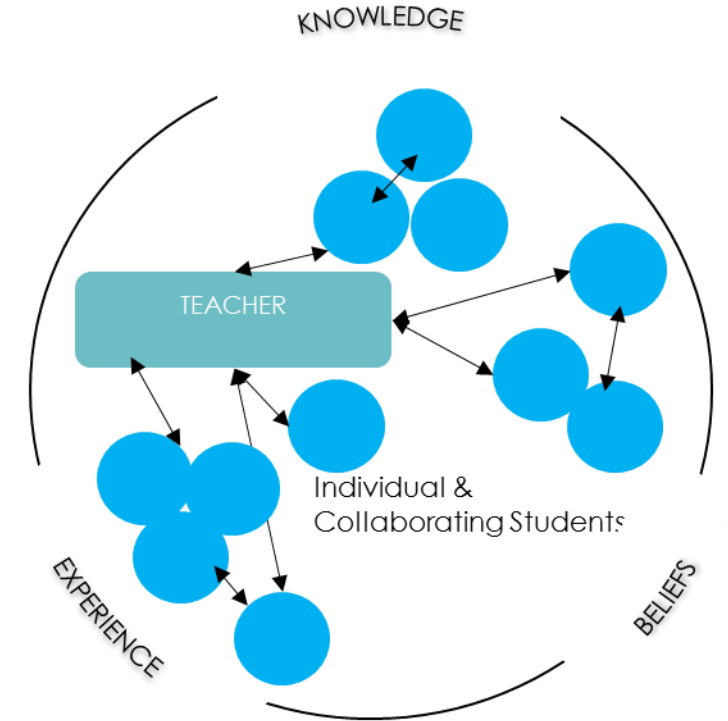
The new paradigm together with pandemic has forced us to re-imagine learning environments to ensure safe and healthy but at the same time a supportive learning environment.

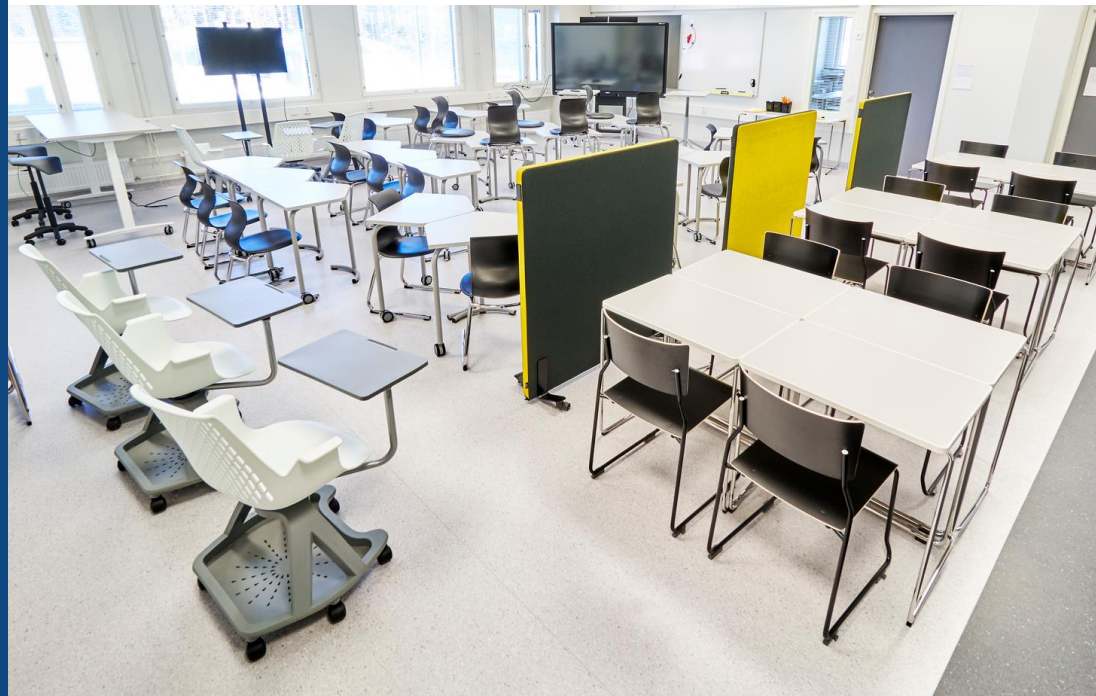
