

HIGHER EDUCATION IN FINLAND




Two complementary sectors

STUDYING AND LIVING COSTS



Tuition fees

If you are from outside the EU, you are subject to tuition fees in English-taught bachelor's and masters.

Your annual tuition fee depends on the degree programme, varying between 8000€ and 20.000€ per year.



Scholarships

Scholarships in Finland are offered by the individual universities.

Check with the university of your choice what kind of scholarships, fee waiver or early bird discount options they have on offer.

Living costs

- You are expected to cover your own living costs
- For accommodation, food, transport etc. you'll need 900-1200€ per month, depending on the location



STUDENT RESIDENCE PERMIT



Apply for your residence permit

Once you've received your admission decision you should start your residence permit process as soon as possible!

You'll need to have valid insurance and proof of financing.

Your five steps to study in Finland

1 CHOOSE YOUR PROGRAMME

Find your preferred study programmes on the Studyinfo.fi database, or on the Finnish universities' websites.



2 CHECK THE PROGRAMME DETAILS

Review the admissions process, the application deadlines, tuition fees, and the scholarships the university may offer.



3 APPLY FOR ADMISSION

Follow the university's instructions! Make sure you apply on time and that you have included all the required documentation.



4 WAIT FOR ADMISSION RESULTS

Waiting can be the hardest part! If you are admitted, remember to accept your study place.



5 PREPARE FOR ARRIVAL

Apply for your student residence permit. Arrange your student housing, and buy your ticket to Finland!



LIFE IN FINLAND



Finnish or Swedish language studies

Even when your degree is offered in English, you can usually add Finnish or Swedish courses into your studies.

Knowledge of the local language helps you in connecting, advancing your career and simply feeling at home in Finland.

After your graduation

You can apply for a two-year post-graduation residence permit to look for work or to start a business in Finland.
